Not allow any form of discrimination in its actions or decisions, be it discrimination of any kind such as race, colour, sex, sexual orientation, language, religion, political or other opinion, national or social origin,

	The WAE Judge Committee shall select the Tournament Judge Commission taking into account the existence of WAE goals or policies concerning geographical distribution and gender equity. The Tournament Judge Commission will be advised to the Executive Board by the WAE Judge Commission and confirmed by the Executive Board.
6. Reason	To make gender equity more visible in the WAE Constitution and reflect best practice in explicitly stating non- discrimination, establishment of safe and harassment-free environments, promoting Athletes' rights.
