WAE DTAC report



WAE Congress Munich/GER, June 5th, 2022

As Europe has emerged out of the Covid pandemic the new Development & Technical assistance committee has begun to establish a direction of travel – we would however appreciate more focussed guidance from the Executive.

The 2021/22 committee comprised:

Stephen Tully (UK) – Chair

Aris Korbetis (Greece)

Andreas Theofylaktou (Cyprus)

Bettina Kratzmueller (Austria) – co-opted

We held five on line meetings during the year.

Direction

We commenced the year by examining the aims of WAE as published in the Strategic Plan – 2021/23.

There was one clear directive for DTAC. To research and promote gender balance throughout Member Associations in Europe – see below and the separate Gender Equality report published by Bettina Kratzmueller.

In order to maintain some continuity with previous initiatives, a conference call was held with former DTAC Chair Mrs Evelyn Papadopoulou in Nov 2021 who explained the direction she had pursued and issues she had encountered during her tenure. We were grateful for her input.

We also made contact earlier in the year with the World Archery Centre in Switzerland (Tom Dielen) The purpose was to discuss the wider use of the Centre as a valuable asset for the benefit of European Member Associations. We are now in contact with the new Operations Manager — Frederic Michel and hope to work with him to develop more attractive (inclusive) packages to promote the Centre, marketed at more affordable prices.

We have advertised the opportunity of grants through the Olympic solidarity programme. Although most Associations are aware of these, we have emphasised the grants are available to member association via their National Olympic committees. There are 21 separate programmes dealing with numerous schemes from coaching to strategic governance. The scheme is aimed at all sports but some member associations may be worthy candidates.

Survey of membership data

Our starting point has been to try and establish the size, demographics and scale of archery participation across Europe. It would appear that WAE does not maintain a record of this information. (e mail sent to Alessandra Colasante 29th Oct 21).

We formulated a brief Survey which was sent to each of the member associations in Feb 2022. The survey is attached as appendix 1 and included of 13 basic questions.

The aim of the research was to establish basic size of the archery community and the gender split and age profile in each region.

Unfortunately, despite a number of follow up e mails, the return rate from Member Associations has been disappointing and we were not able to establish any clear trends.

Going forward we would like to try again with more high level support and we would recommend to the Executive that the survey is undertaken again through a professional research agency.

The survey results received indicate that the gender split in European archery is circa 75% male; 25% female but the data is based on a very small sample group and no meaningful base data can be drawn. Indications are that the majority of participants are men aged 50+.

It is also evident that many of the Member Association have a very small membership with varying levels of corporate governance.

There is clearly much work to do in this area.

International Women's Day

Working with Bettina Kratzmueller we helped gather case studies to celebrate the important and influential role women play in our sport. We hoped that the publicity gained around this initiative has helped to raise the profile of females members and serve to attract more interest in archery.

Plans for the future

It is clear that development (in all its forms) must run through every area of European archery. This is the approach World Archery takes in its strategic objectives and we feel we should follow suit.

In order to do this we need to work much more closely with the Board and we need to agree more targeted strategic objectives.

I will be attending the European Youth Games in August 2022 and look forward to meeting many of you there.
