Warm up during all days of the competition will be organized according the schedule published.

3.3 Equipment inspection

Equipment inspection will follow the program of the official practice and will be held at the official practice field.

The teams have to confirm by signing at the registration their acknowledgement of group in which they will come to the equipment inspection (group 1 or group 2).

Each team will be called (in the English alphabetical order) and invited by the judges to the dedicated place for the Equipment inspection in the competition field.

- All teams shall wear or bring their team uniforms.
- Spare equipment, binoculars and bags you intent to bring into the field must also be brought for inspection.
- Coach binocular will be checked by judge before use in team event and

Athlete (back) Numbers

Athlete numbers will be issued on the day of the qualification round (with the score cards).

Athlete numbers must be worn on the quiver or thigh, facing the waiting line while shooting, throughout the event including finals.

Toilets

Portable toilets will be present along the fields of competition and at the Practice field.

Environment

Team Managers, please instruct your team members to use the litter bins located on the competition, practice ranges and common areas always and clear the area you have used on the FOP before leaving.

Water

Water (bottles) will be distributed around the field.

Non-Smoking

This is a non-smoking event.

Smoking is forbidden inside public buildings and all competition and training areas. This also includes electronic cigarettes, refer to book 4, Art. 26.4.

The non-smoking area will apply on the entire Olympic Centre venue.

Rounds

There are two (2) courses for the two qualification rounds. All qualification rounds are set up at Olympic Centre venue.

The target assignment will be handed out on the day of the official practice.

Regrouping of archers for the 2nd qualification round and new start list will be prepared.

For the 2nd Qualification Round the division will change to the other course.

1st Qualification Round

- Recurve Women, Recurve Men, Barebow Women, Barebow Men → **Yellow Course**
- Compound Women, Compound Men + all U21 (R, C, B / W, M) → **Green Course**

2nd Qualification Round

- Compound Women, Compound Men + all U21 (R, C, B / W, M) → **Yellow Course**
- Recurve Women, Recurve Men, Barebow Women, Barebow Men → **Green Course**

Individual Eliminations

The top 22 athletes per category from the 2nd Qualification Rounds will qualify for the 1st Elimination Round.

1st and 2nd are qualified for semi-finals, matches will be run as fast as possible.

Therefore, the times indicated in the schedule are just a reference. Please be aware of that and follow the competition to be prepared when the match of your athlete could be scheduled. Only the start of the morning session and the start of the afternoon session will be respected as indicated in the competition schedule.

Team Elimination Round

The top 8 teams in each category qualifying from the two (2) Qualification Rounds will shoot quarter-finals, with byes, the winners will shoot semi-finals.

Individual Finals Round, Team & Mixed Team Finals Round

The top 4 teams in each mixed team category will shoot semi-finals and finals.

TV Coverage

Team and Mixed Team finals will have live TV coverage on World Archery Europe.
Individual finals will have live TV coverage on World Archery (only gold matches) and World Archery Europe.

Live Streaming links will be on lanseo event page and WAE website.

3.4 Appeal procedure

- An Appeal form is attached to this document.
- In case of an intent to appeal or an actual appeal, the times indicated on the Appeal form must be considered.
- Appeal forms should be given to the Chairman of the Tournament Judge Commission or to their deputy.
- A fee of 50 USD (or 50 EUR) must be paid to the Chairman of the Tournament Judge Commission, for the appeal to be valid.
- If the appeal is upheld by the Jury of Appeal, the fee will be returned. In the case of the appeal being rejected, the fee will not be returned.

Technical Matters

According to the rules it is not allowed to bring any electronic devices to the course. This includes smart phones and smart watches.

SCORING & RESULTS

There will be electronic scoring and paper scoring during all competition. The paper score sheets must be filled in by the athletes themselves. All the athletes in the same group must verify that the correct scores are entered.

Please instruct your athletes correctly fill in the scorecards including total score, number of 6's, number of 5's and sign the cards before handing them back after each round. All scorecards of each group must be returned together by one person, chosen as representative of the group. In case of tied score on positions 2 and 22, a shoot-off will be arranged. Shoot off target will be in the central area.

Due to environmental preservation and responsible behavior toward nature we will not have any printed material.

- Printed documents will be published only on the board at the competition venue and in the lobby of the hotel.

REMINDER on RULES

5.1 Dress regulations

Rule Book 4 – Ch. 31

31.1 ATHELETES

Athletes shall wear shirts with name and country at all times.

Sport shoes or walking boots shall be worn by all athletes and officials, these may be different styles but shall cover the entire foot.

Athletes may wear trousers of their choice for the Qualification round.

Athletes shall wear full Team uniform, which shall not include denim, for Team Rounds and Medal Matches.

Clothing and equipment shall not be camouflage. No oversize or baggy type trousers are allowed.

31.2 TEAM OFFICIALS

Shall have their country on their shirt or jacket, and shall be the same colour, so that they are easily recognisable as part of the team.

In addition, The dress regulations found in Book 3, Article 20.1 shall apply. (Book 4, Ch.22)

5.2 Accreditation cards rules

Rule Book 2 – 3.8 Accreditation

3.8.1.1. Proof of accreditation shall be carried at all times on the competition area and shall be shown on request of appropriate officials.

3.8.1.2. Only holders of appropriate accreditation shall be allowed onto the relevant parts of the competition area.

Accreditation card:

Athletes and team officials, registered in WAREOS, will be issued an accreditation and lanyard.

Please ensure all details are correctly entered in WAREOS.

Accreditation will consist of, a photograph, full name, role, category/bow discipline, country of representation, individual World Archery ID code and access privileges.

Photographs

Will be taken on venue during unofficial and official practice. For athlete who do not already have one.

For a valid photograph, persons are to smile and wear their official Member Association team uniform. No hats or sunglasses can be worn.

Lost/Damage/Replacement costs:

For those persons that unfortunately forget to bring, damage or lose their accreditation, can purchase another accreditation at the event for the cost of 30 EUR (€).

Fair Play

All archers should enjoy the competition and no archer should do anything that spoils this for another.

Un-sportsmanlike behaviour

- Un-sportsmanlike behaviour will not be tolerated from athletes, coaches or spectators.
- If it is suspected that distances, slopes, cuts are being communicated by accredited persons, then accreditation will be removed. Spectators will be removed from the viewing area.
- English is the language that must be used when talking to athletes when competing, and yes, no, good and bad are all the words you need to use during the individual event.

Consequences of Breaking Rules

Book 4, Chapter 27, Article 27.8.2.

In the case of a Judge's timing an athlete and observing him exceeding the time limit, at the third and all subsequent warnings during that stage of the competition, the athlete shall lose the highest scoring arrow at the target.

Officials on course

No officials are allowed on the course. In case of a technical problem or the need of medical attention the group shall contact the judge, who will refer the problem to the chairman of the judge commission who will seek out the team captain in order to care of the problem – therefore it is very important for the team manager or representative to remain in the central area.

LOGISTICS & TRANSPORTS

6.1 Transportation

Daily transportation information and schedules will be placed at the competition field and notice boards at all the official event hotels.

All equipment transported in official shuttles shall be fully packed in bowcases. No quiver, arrows, or any other part of bows will be allowed in the seating area of the buses.

6.2 Meals during the event

Breakfast and Dinner will be served at the hotel restaurants.

Lunch will be offered on the venue in exchange of a voucher that you will receive during registration according to the schedule below:

- Breakfast: 06:30- 09:30 hrs.
- Lunch: 11:30 a.m. – 2:30 p.m. hrs.
- Dinner: 7:00 to 9:00 p.m. hrs.
- Final Party: 9:30 p.m. (at Olympic Centre)

**Times will adjust to the competition schedule as and when required. Please also note the information boards in the hotels.*

6.3 Internet Access and additional hotel charges

Internet access will be free of charge in the hotel and on the venues.

All other expenses including laundry and minibar, etc will be covered by the participants themselves. Any damages will be charged to the participants national team.

7.1 Medal ceremonies

Athletes are requested to proceed straight to the mixed zone or the ceremony area.

Interviews will take place at the Mixed Zone and athletes will be requested to pass through the mixed zone to speak with the media.

Anti-Doping control will follow World Archery rules.

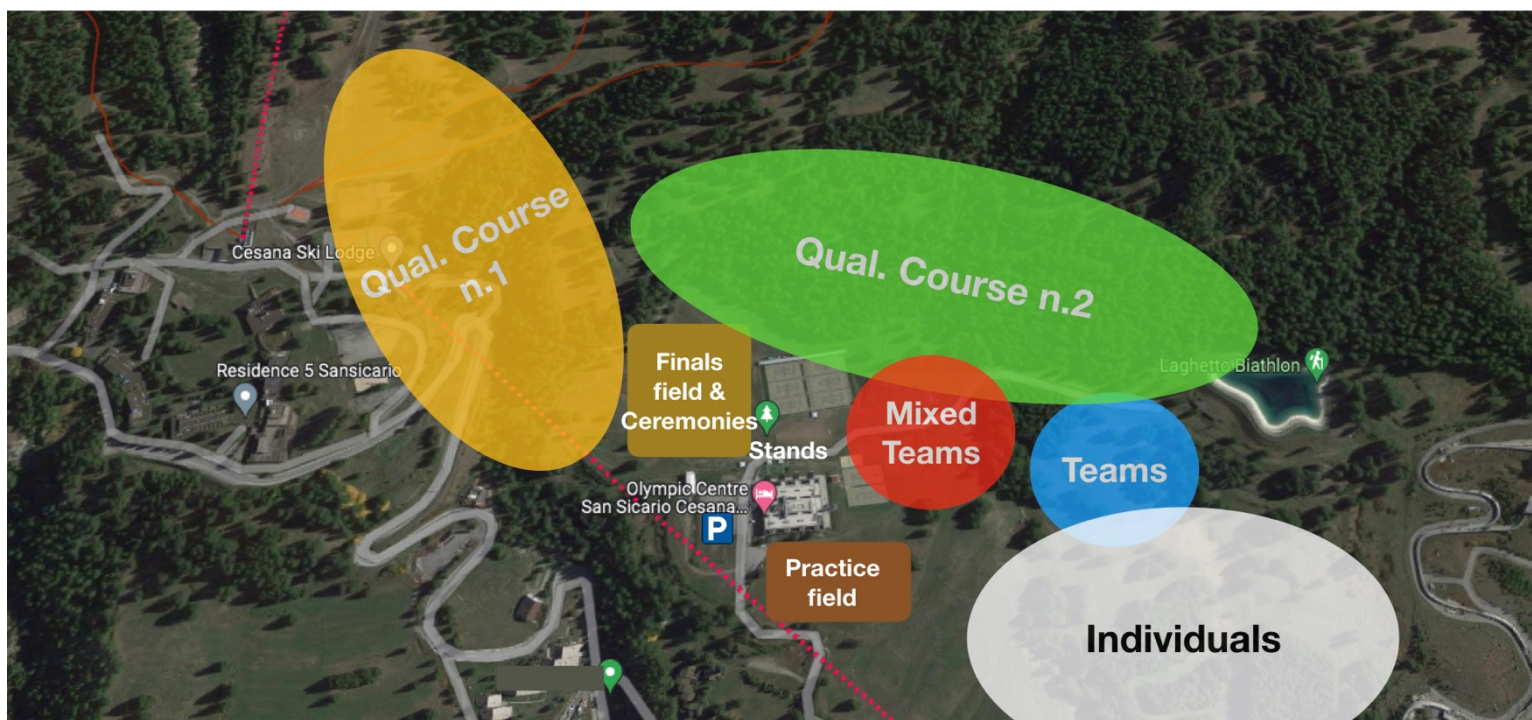
Athletes should bring their passports and/or accreditation cards to the anti-doping control station if selected for a test.

Article 3.13.3.1:

An intention to appeal when it might affect the progression of an athlete from one stage of the competition to the next, shall be expressed in writing and lodged with the chairperson of the Tournament Judge Commission within five minutes of the end of the relevant round or match, whichever applies. During the Finals of match play rounds, the notice of intent to file an appeal shall be given within five minutes of the end of the match, or prior to the start of the next match, whichever is first.

Article 3.13.8:

Jury decisions shall be minuted and reported to the appellant, the chairperson of the Tournament Judge Commission and the organisers before the beginning of the next stage of the competition or before the awarding of prizes.

Article 3.13.4:

Amount paid is reviewed and determined by the World Archery Executive Board on an annual basis.
